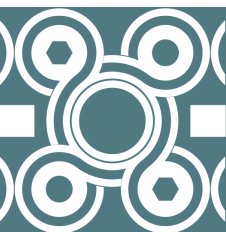
DEVELOPING INCLUSIVE EDUCATION IN THE MEDITERRANEAN

WHAT'S DIEM?

DIEM (Developing Inclusive Education in the Mediterranean) is a transnational project funded by the **Interreg NEXT MED** Programme that aims to improve access to inclusive and high-quality **education** in the Mediterranean region. The project focuses on the Cultural Heritage sector, addressing the gap between education and **labour market** needs. It brings together universities, public institutions, and local communities to develop a **shared** training system and strengthen **skills**, employability, and social inclusion. Through innovative tools such as digital learning platforms, training programmes, and **community-based** activities, DIEM supports young people and vulnerable groups in gaining the **competencies** needed to access job opportunities.

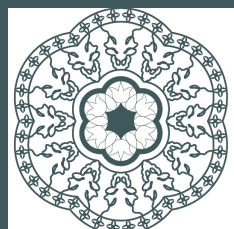
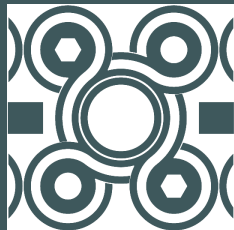

OBJECTIVES

DIEM is built around a set of interrelated objectives that address skills development across different professional profiles within the **Cultural Heritage** sector. A first priority is to strengthen the competences of CH managers and university professors, supporting them in adopting and promoting internationally recognized **standards** and principles and enabling them to act as multipliers within the project's **training** dynamics. At the same time, the project targets tertiary graduates by providing them with CH **management** and **finance-related skills** that can facilitate their entry into CH businesses and institutions, improving employability and supporting a more effective match between **education** and **labour market** needs. DIEM places a strong emphasis on inclusion by fostering technical and managerial skills among vulnerable and underrepresented groups - such as NEETs, socially excluded individuals, women, youth and unemployed people - especially in rural or less developed areas, with the aim of widening access to **opportunities** and strengthening local socio-economic development connected to Cultural Heritage.



METHODOLOGY

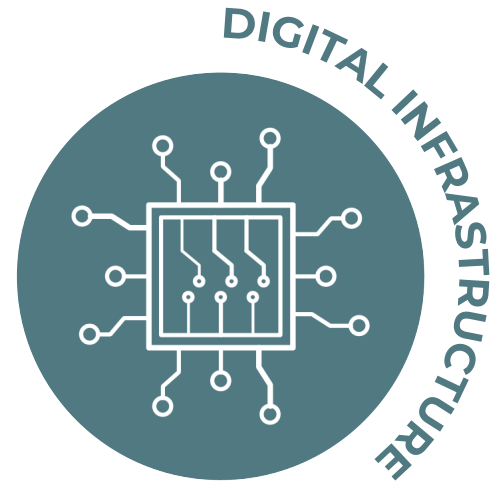
DIEM adopts a transnational and multi-layered approach based on:

- ❖ **HARMONISATION OF UNIVERSITY EDUCATION SYSTEMS AND CREDIT RECOGNITION**
- ❖ **DEVELOPMENT OF A SHARED DIGITAL TRAINING PLATFORM**
- ❖ **IMPLEMENTATION OF TRAINING OF TRAINERS (TOT) PROGRAMMES**
- ❖ **CASCADE TRAINING MODEL TO TRANSFER KNOWLEDGE ACROSS TARGET GROUPS**
- ❖ **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT THROUGH INNOVATIVE TOOLS SUCH AS PODCASTS AND MOBILEHUBS**



CONNECTING LEARNING ACROSS BORDERS

A shared digital infrastructure is at the core of DIEM's approach. Through an online **platform**, participants can access training materials, engage in **learning activities**, and connect with a transnational network. This ensures flexible, accessible, and continuous learning beyond **geographical limitations**.



MOBILE HUB



BRINGING LEARNING TO COMMUNITIES

The DIEM Mobile Hub brings training directly to local communities. Through a dedicated **mobile unit**, the project reaches remote and underserved areas, delivering **on-site activities**, workshops, and engagement initiatives - ensuring that **learning opportunities** are **accessible** to all.

LEARNING THAT MULTIPLIES

DIEM adopts a **cascade** training model to ensure scalability and **long-term impact**. Trained experts (GROUP A) transfer knowledge and skills to graduates, young people and local communities (GROUP B and C), creating a **multiplying effect** that extends learning across **communities** and countries.



BREAKING LANGUAGE BARRIERS

To facilitate communication across diverse linguistic contexts, DIEM integrates AI-based **translation** tools. These tools support knowledge **exchange** among partners and participants, making training content more accessible and **inclusive**, and enabling effective collaboration across the **Mediterranean** region.

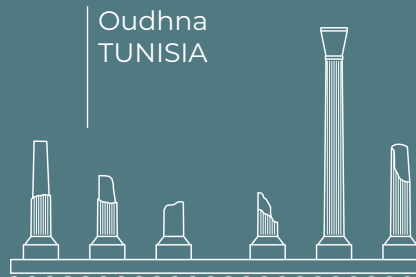
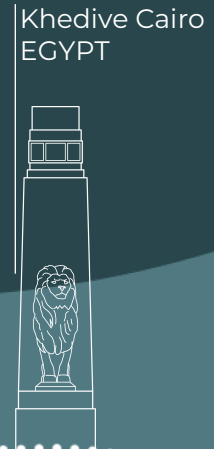
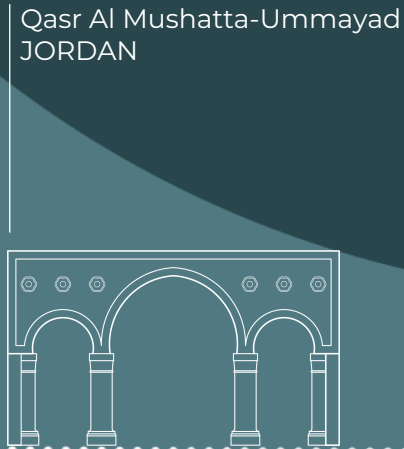
